Conference maps for Europe and South America in Colonia II, Urf Durfal house rules, and postal rules for After the Holocaust, World War I, and Frigg It! are also available. The Costikyan Publishing Empire is also offering: the New York Conspiracy Hymnal for \$1, all five back issues of GIGO for \$2, or 50¢ each; issues 2 and 3 of THE INVERTED GRAPEFRUIT at 75¢ each or \$1.25 for both; issue one of FIRE THE ARQUEBUSIERS! for 50¢ and PHOENIX for \$2. Persons with subscriptions to Urf Durfal may cash their subscriptions in for any Costikyan Publishing Empire product at the rate of 25¢/issue.

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URF DURFAL GOES WEEKLY!!

As of now, Urf Durfal will be published on a weekly schedule. Most issues will be one or two pages long; the exception will be every third or fourth issue (depending on how much time I have), which will be the normal 12 pages (except for occasional 24-page double issues).

Game deadlines will be staggered, so that some will occur on one week, some the next, and so forth. Deadlines will remain three weeks long; adjudications for games GM'ed by me will be printed the same week as the deadlines. Other games will have a week gap between deadline and publication of the moves (to allow the gamesmasters to get their adjudications to me); thus the games GM'ed by Dave Barlow, Tom Gould, and Scott Rosenberg will have moves published every four weeks.

When it is necessary to separate builds from spring moves, there will be a two week deadline for the builds (you're not supposed to have diplomacy before builds anyway), except that the games GM'ed by Dave, Tom, and Scott will have a week and a half (the extra half week giving them time to get the builds to me).

Effective immediately, everyone has twice as many issues left in his subscription as previously. One or two page issues will count as one issue for subscription purposes; twelve or ten page issues will count as two; 18 or 24 page issues will count as four. Sub rates are not 1/2 sub credits/\$2.

Any players will receive the 1 or 2 page issues when they're printed. You'll get whatever issues you miss when the 12 page issue is published. Deadlines are printed on the last page.

RAND CORPORATION STUDY X-735-82 May 13, 1982

SUMMARY:

1. The pointed stick (commonly termed "spear") costs approximately \$3 in 1972 dollars to manufacture, while the M-18 infantry firearm costs \$26 in 1972 dollars.
2. Previous studies have shown that recruits in the People's Army of Southern Woggista are almost completely lacking in technical skills. It takes approximately 26 hours to teach a Southern Woggistani to strip and reassemble an M-18 (as compared with 2.4 hours for American personnel). Furthermore, the jamming ratio of a simplified M-18A3 in the hands of Southern Woggistani personnel is approximately .6 per use-hour; the ratio is .13 per use-hour in the US Army.
3. The majority of the Southern Woggistani population belong to a tribal culture in which the most common weapons are the spear, sling, and bow. Every tribal youth is thoroughly instructed in the use of these weapons, almost from birth.
4. This study has shown that the spear is a useful weapon in close-action combat. Given the experience of Southern Woggistanis with the weapon, and the limited visibility in the jungle terrain which covers most of Northern and Southern Woggistan, the spear will almost definitely prove to be an effective weapon in any hypothetical encounter to take place between the two nations. Further, given the high jamming ratio of even simplified SMG's in the hands of Southern Woggistani personnel, it seems clear that a spear is infinitely more useful than a jammed sub-machinegun, especially when the wielder of an SMG is as likely to blow his own head off as inflict damage on enemy personnel, even were he capable of firing it.

THEREFORE, we recommend that the United States Army make available to the People's Army of Southern Woggistan a number of carbon-steel spears, manufactured in the United States (Southern Woggistan doesn't have the industrial capacity to produce high-grade steel).

Bids were submitted in accordance with memo USASC #10642, July 22, 1985 for the manufacture of the Light Infantry Portable Close-Action Weapon, code-name "SPEAR". The two most favorable bids were:

American Light Metals Corp: \$2.79 per weapon, single-unit assembly.

The Great Northern Timber Company and U.S. Steel submitted a combined bid; suggested two-piece assembly of the weapon. Wooden shaft to be manufactured by GNTC at \$.84/shaft metal spear-heads to be manufactured by USS at \$.43/head, for a combined cost of \$1.27/LIPCAW.

In accordance with the guidelines for cost-cutting in DoD laid down by Memorandum of Jan. 16, 1984 by President Kennedy, we respectfully suggest that the second bid be accepted.

COST OVERRUN ACCOUNT FORM

As a result of Bill 85-206, dated November 3rd, 1985, which forbade depreciation allowances to all mining operations, we regret to inform you that the cost of raw steel has risen approximately 23.4%. Additionally, the closure of the border with Canada, undertaken to restrict entry of illegal immigrants seeking to escape that war-torn nation, has resulted in the cessation of the importation of Canadian timber, causing a rise in the price of hardwood of 36.8%.

Thus, we regret to announce that U.S. Steel cannot manufacture LIPCAW heads at a cost of less than \$.52/head, and that the cost to manufacture LIPCAW shafts by GNTC has risen from \$.84 to \$1.06. Neither company is able to manufacture either item at a lower cost, except under extreme hardship conditions, which, under Paragraph 16, Clause 43 of Contract #166692 of October 28, 1985 would allow both companies to void the contract by returning funds paid to date.

Thus, unfortunately, the total cost of the LIPCAW weapon will be \$1.58 per weapon, not \$1.27 as specified in the contract mentioned above.

MLAI LIGHT INFANTRY PORTABLE CLOSE-ACTION WEAPON (LIPCAW)

The LIPCAW was developed in response to the need for an easily-portable, simple weapon for use by indigenous allied forces. It resembles in form a long, pointed stick, and is utilized for the purpose of punching sutures or holes in enemy personnel.

A. ASSEMBLY

Take Assembly Unit A ("shaft", see diagram) and rest butt on ground, holding unit at 45° angle from ground. Holding Assembly Unit A in left hand, take Assembly Unit B ("head", see diagram) and screw onto Assembly Unit A, using a clockwise twisting motion. Press the plastic locking button on the base of Assembly Unit B (labelled "C" in diagram) into place. LIPCAW is now assembled.

B. USE

The LIPCAW can be utilized in three manners:

1. Thrusting: Hold the shaft with both hands about two-thirds of the way down the shaft. The hands should be placed about ½ meter (approx. 20 inches) apart on the shaft. The shaft should pass under the left arm and across the left side of the body (see Diagram B). Jab and thrust with the point of the weapon, utilizing a swinging-arm motion.
2. Throwing: Hold weapon slightly behind the rear of the middle of the shaft with the right hand. Bring right arm back, thrust forward, and release weapon. The weapon will travel up to 10 meters (approx. 30 feet) in the hands of trained personnel.
3. Set Against Charge: To be used against charging enemy personnel. Place butt of weapon against ground. Crouch down, holding weapon at about 25° angle. Direct tip of weapon into on-charging enemy personnel.

C. CAUTIONS

The MLAI LIPCAW is not to be used against enemy tanks or other vehicles; the carbon steel tip will not penetrate heavy armor.

The LIPCAW should be used primarily in ambush situations, or other circumstances in which the enemy will not be able to bring fire weapons into play.

and metal tips therefrom. I called together my subordinates to introduce them to the
weapon, with which we hope to arm the men of the division. During the meeting, I
attempted to demonstrate assembly of the weapon by screwing the head onto the shaft
of the weapon, as directed on page 69 of the FM-701 Light Infantry Equipment and
Tactics manual. Unfortunately, the metal head has been manufactured approximately
.6 centimeters smaller than the wooden shaft. Thus, the weapon cannot be assembled
as per instructions. Please clarify.

(The following is a letter from W. Elmer Hinton, Jr, to David Barlow regarding a game in this zine).

Sir;

As a player in 1976JJ, for the position of Germany, I would like to submit two builds, namely armies, placed on my two open home centers, Berlin and Kiel respectively; I do not expect this will be permitted. I think it highly unlikely that this will reach you by tomorrow, although letters to as far south as Worcester, Ma., Westmarch, Empire of NH, have been exchanged in one day; I have no idea as to whether or not the additional distance will hold up the process the additional day and make these orders late.

In the event that these orders are late, I would demand that they be accepted on the grounds that this is the first turn after which an orphan has been revived, that to those not accustomed to a zine with split schedules may have not notices the earlier date set, simply the lower one, that also, due to my position as Gamesmaster of LORD OF VALENTIA and its 400 players I have had to resign most of my games and am unable to send early orders for any that I am in, usually sending them the monday before the deadline. This practice is one I am well able to do under periods of heavy workloads and due to the similar mid-week deadline foolishness I was forced to resign Liasons Dangereuses games long ago. I must thereby serve notice that by setting a mid-week deadline, you are deliberately forcing a player out of a game he has no intention of leaving.

I would agree that Had I signed up knowing these things I would certainly have little grounds for complaint, but by simply being a player in a game which you have picked up I am now subject to your rules through no will of my own. While I refuse, therefor, to resign I will be unable to play under the circumstances.

It is my considered opinion that the other players would agree.

I await your decision.

RESPONSE:

Sirrah Hinton, Monsieur Barlow has no part in setting the deadlines, except inasmuch as he fails to get his adjudications in on time, forcing the lateness of this zine, as in the present case. Wherefore your letter would better have been sent to me.

After careful consideration of the letter, and some thought, I have come to the following considered conclusion: you are an asshole.

Firstly: "While I refuse, therefor (sic), to resign I will be unable to play under the circumstances." As I read this, it means that you will not resign, but neither will you submit moves. According to my house rules, I cannot remove you from a game until you have NMR'd twice in a row. Currently, I'm publishing two magazines, writing for the college AM radio station, attending college full time, and designing two games. Apparently, you are unable to allocation your time efficiently.

I believe you will find (if you ever mature emotionally) that it is possible to get positive action out of others (i.e., make friends and influence people) by acting and communicating in a pleasant matter. The belligerent, arrogant, and pretentious tone of your letter is badly received. Fuck you.

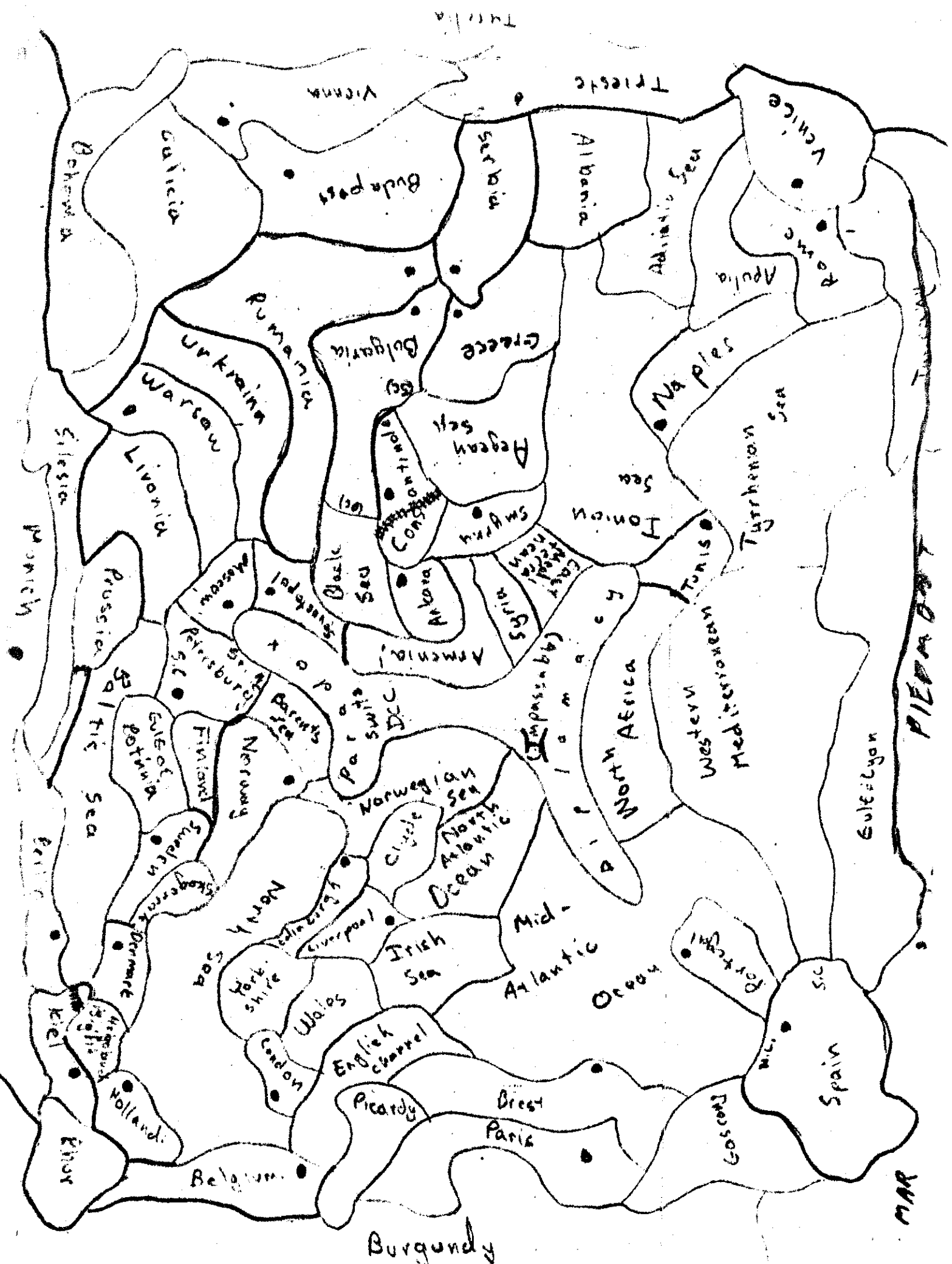

NOTES:

1. Openings in YOUNGSTOWN (probably II) are available at \$3 plus sub. I currently have two people signed up, and three others expressing interest. The \$3 is refunded as for the same rules as regular Diplomacy (see note 2). I also have openings in SWISS VARIANT II and MACHIAVELLI (no one's signed up for either of these) at \$1 plus sub (the dollar is not refunded).
2. And, of course, I've got openings in regular Diplomacy at \$5 plus sub. The \$5 is refunded at the end of the game or when you are eliminated, but is forfeit if you drop out. Additionally, each time you NMR or NBR, one dollar is forfeit from the \$5 total.
3. The cover to this issue was done by Gail S. Barton.
4. If you are truly interested in the Diplomacy hobby, you should refrain from joining the International Diplomacy Association/North America (or IDA/NA). One joins by sending \$2 to the President, Bob Hartwig, 304 Slater Hall, U of Iowa, Iowa City, IA, 52242. Strangely enough, non-North Americans may join the IDA/NA for \$5. You might also refrain from joining The Diplomacy Association (TDA), which is even worse than the IDA/NA; joining this force is accomplished by sending a letter to Besh (John Beshara, 155 W 68th St, New York, NY, 10023) telling him you want to join. You really ought to refrain from joining all the other silly groups, like the National Games Club/North America (an invasion by the British NGC), or Charles Doehrer's risible rump IDA, or W. Elmer Hinton's ridiculous "Gamemaster/Publisher Association".
5. Ben Grossman and I recently published a 72-page D&D AND TRAVELLER zine entitled "PHOENIX". Phoenix is the result of the merger of the old Conspiracy D&D zines, Fire the Arquebusier-!, The Haven Herald, and The Smoky Dragon. 6. You don't know what I've gone through to get this issue out. Firstly, Dave Barlow was late with his adjudications, and without them only one game would have been carried with this issue, so I wound up delaying the issue by two weeks. (or is it three by now?) Secondly, I bought 100 electro-stencils from Tom Gould for \$30---and now I can't find them! Which is why this page is typed up on a regular stencil. (This is also why there are so many typos on this page. My typewriter is self-correcting; that is, when I make a typo with my carbon ribbon film, I hit the special backspace button, type the incorrect letter (which is then lifted from the page by an adhesive correcting ribbon), and retype the correct letter. This means that the paper originals I make for electrostenciling can have relatively few errors, as typos are easily correctible. With stencils, however, no carbon ribbon is imprinted on the stencil: I'm actually punching holes through the plastic stencil with my type ball. The only way to correct errors is with corflu---and, since I haven't had to type normal stencils for quite a while, I don't have any corflu).
7. Then I realized I'd run out of paper. I went to the local stationary store, which was out; then I went to the local print shop, where they sold me a ream of offset paper for \$3.18 (not bad---my usual price is \$2.50). Offset paper is slightly glossier and thinner than mimeo paper, so I'll get some print-through and back-printing. The woman who sold me the paper is Sheila D'Amassa, wife of Don D'Amassa, noted local sf fan. We met at a RISFA meeting once, a year or so ago. She didn't recognize me, so I didn't recognize her, if you know what I mean. Just as well: I didn't get along too well with the RISFA people.

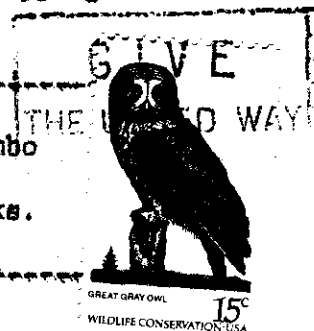
